A **30-question Interest Assessment** which matches your interests to careers. Your answers create your Interest Profile which leads to position types you could qualify for. Clicking on a position-type leads to job openings, wage information, employment trends, training options, related positions and more. A great starting off point!

Check off the **soft skills** you would like to utilize in your next position. On the next screen, you will see position-types that call for those skills. Clicking on a position type will give you a summary report citing the knowledge, employment trends, training options, salary ranges, open positions and peripheral careers of that position-type.

Enter the type of **technology** you would like to utilize in your next position. On the next screen, you will see position-types that call for knowledge of that hard skill. Clicking on a position type will give you a summary report citing the knowledge, employment trends, training options, salary ranges, open positions and the peripheral careers of that position-type.

On the left, enter the keywords of your desired position. On the next screen, browse position-types that call for those keywords. Clicking on a position-type presents a profile including the knowledge, skills, trends, salary info and vacancies of that position. On the right, there is a **30-question career assessment** which will offer your personality-type based on the Holland Codes and point toward position-types you could qualify for with a link on the bottom for open jobs. You can then toggle between job search sites that have these or very similar positions. In the middle, you can browse careers by industry.

Enter your current job to **find career matches** that you can bridge into. If you already have a career in mind, click "Select a Career." Enter the job you want. On the next screen, plug in your previous job. Click Go for a side-by-side comparison noting skill gaps. You can also uncover skills, trends, salary info and job openings.
