

National Dislocated Workers Grants assist customers who are affected by large scale layoffs caused by unexpected economic events.









Training Opportunities Program (TOP) Section 30

- You may be eligible for up to an additional 26 weeks of unemployment benefits while in approved training
- Your work search requirements may be waived while attending full-time, approved training
- Submit application to the Department of Unemployment Assistance (DUA) by the 20th paid week of benefits

Unemployment Insurance

Unemployment Insurance (UI) provides temporary, partial wage replacement.

 You must be able, available and actively seeking work while collecting UI benefits.

Re-Employment Services and Eligibility Assessment (RESEA)

RESEA is a Federal grant program for customers receiving UI benefits.

If you are selected for the RESEA program, please pay close attention to the DUA notification letter with important information and **DEADLINE DATES**.

This RESEA notification will be sent to:

- Your UI Online inbox; and
- Received by US mail

You must **take action and respond prior** to the deadline dates stated within the letter.
